HOMEWORK 7 - MANIPULATING THE DOM

- 1. Read section 15.1 Web Programming Basics, 15.2 Events, and 15.3 Scripting Documents
- 2. Create an HTMl file named a7.htm, a CSS file named a7.css, and a JavaScript file named a7.js.
- 3. Add a <main> element to your HTML file and below the <main> element (not inside it) create a <section> element.
- 4. Modify your CSS file as follows:
 - 1. Add class rules for classes named *box1*, *box2*, *box3*, and *box4*. Each class rule should stylize the element with that class name so that the element has a fixed width and height (size of your choosing), a distinct background color, and distinct font color.
 - 2. Add a class rule for the <button> element to give your buttons some styling.
- 5. In your JavaScript file, dynamically add the following elements to the DOM.
 - 1. Append 3 <div> elements to the <main> element.
 - 1. The <div> elements should have a *class* attribute set to "box1", "box2", and "box3", respectively.
 - 2. Each <div> element should have some text in it (text of your choosing).
 - 2. Append 4 <buttons> to the <section> element.
 - 1. A <button> element with "Append box" as its text, the type attribute set to "button", and set the id attribute to a string of your choosing.
 - 2. A <button> element with "Remove box" as its text, the type attribute set to "button", and set the id attribute to a string of your choosing.
 - 3. A <button> element with "Modify box" as its text, the type attribute set to "button", and set the id attribute to a string of your choosing.
 - 4. A <button> element with "Mystery" as its text, the type attribute set to "button", and set the id attribute to a string of your choosing.
 - 5. Register event handlers for each button.
 - 1. The Append box button handler should append a new <div> element to the children of <main>. The new <div> element should have its class attribute set to "box4".
 - 2. The Remove box button handler should remove the first child of the <main> element.
 - 3. The Modify box button handler should change the class attribute of the first child of <main> to "box4" if it is currently "box1", "box2", or "box3". Otherwise set the class attribute to "box1".
 - 4. The Mystery button handler should modify the DOM in some interesting way.
